

Policy on Smoking

Rationale

The South Australian Rifle Association (S.A.R.A.) recognises that environmental tobacco smoke is a health hazard and that non-smokers should be protected from it.

Accordingly, the following policy devised by S.A.R.A. applies to facilities and venues under S.A.R.A. control as from 1/11/2016. This policy applies to all members, administrators, officials, coaches, players and visitors of the S.A.R.A.

Policy on smoking

The S.A.R.A. policy requires:

- administration, bars, dining, eating and office areas to be smoke-free
- change rooms and toilet blocks to be smoke-free
- outdoor spectator grandstands and seated areas to be smoke-free
- access to seated areas, toilets and food outlets to be smoke-free
- · all social functions (including junior

- events, competitions, dinners, fundraising events, meetings) of the organisation to be smoke-free
- coaches, trainers, volunteers and officials to refrain from smoking while they are acting in an official capacity
- players to refrain from smoking while in uniform
- the effects of smoking on performance to be discussed with junior players
- smoke-free behaviour to be incorporated into the code of behaviour for coaches and players.

Non-compliance

Non-compliance with this policy will result in possible removal from the venue and disciplinary action being taken by the S.A.R.A. Board. Anyone wishing to discuss any aspect of this policy is invited to contact S.A.R.A. Executive Officer. Thank you for your cooperation.
